FEEDING INSTRUCTIONS

CONTROLLED FEEDING: Because of the appealing taste, most cats like Wendland's Cat Food right out of the bag. Serve ½ cup twice a day, and increase or decrease the serving size according to the size, age, weight and activity for your cat.

CAFETERIA FEEDING: You may also feed you cat cafeteria style by filling his bowl every morning. Since Cats prefer to nibble rather than eat, this is the ideal, trouble-free way to keep your cat happy and satisfy his desire for nocturnal snacks.

MOIST FEEDING: Wendland's Cat Food may be fed moist if desired. Mix a ratio of one part water to three parts cat food. Milk may be used instead of water as an added treat.

KITTENS: When kittens are 3-5 weeks of age, they should be ready to eat some semi-solid food. Feed all the kitten will eat, moistened with water or milk at four hour intervals. At 5 weeks to 6 months, change to an all dry diet, and gradually reduce moistened feedings until your kitten eats only dry food.

- *Water is essential to your cat's body functions. Provide a dish of fresh, clean water at all times. If your cat refuses water, you can moisten this cat food before serving.*

IMPORTANT: Cat's appetites vary, and it is not unusual for them to lose their interest in food occasionally. This does not necessarily mean they are dissatisfied with the food offered. In most instances they will resume their eating in a day or so without loss of energy. However, should they refuse food beyond this period, it could indicate illness, and you should consult your veterinarian.
